In book club, we have started reading 'The Worst Witch' by Jill Murphy. We have focused on using expression and tone in our reading voices to emphasise understanding. In maths, we have mastered being able to add and subtract 1000 to any number, including problem solving.

Class 5 have made a fantastic start to the new school year! We have been busy already with lots of reading and discovering all about our new class book, Cogheart. We have kicked maths off with learning about place value and really getting to grips with numbers, from 0 all the way up to 1,000,000.

We were also extremely lucky to have a visit to Frickley Country Park last week. We spent the whole day outdoors developing our map reading and navigating skills.

Class 6 have had a great start to the new year with a fantastic trip to Frickley Country Park last Friday, where they learnt all about how to read maps and use compasses.
