Nursery

In Numeracy we have been practising reading and writing numbers to 100 and learning about making numbers 1 more and 1 less. Our Literacy learning is based around the film Wreck-it Ralph and we have spent some time this week finding adjectives ready to write a character profile describing him. Our topic learning this term is all about materials. We have started by learning the names of some common materials and learning words like flexible, soft and transparent to describe their properties.

Year 2

Year 1 and 2 children have watched "Wreck-It Ralph" as an introduction to our topic on materials and their properties. We are also hoping to build upon this by designing and making something after a discussion about which materials are the most suitable for making certain items. This is also the focus of our Literacy this term and we will be discussing character profiles.





Online Safety

The internet is an amazing place for children to play, learn, create and connect, opening up a whole world of exciting possibilities. But with the digital world changing all the time, it is becoming increasingly important to ensure your child is doing this safely. As parents, it can sometimes feel impossible to keep up with this ever changing world and advances in technology – you may feel that your child is more competent than you on a computer, phone or tablet!

As parents and carers it is also our responsibility to ensure that the films our children are watching, whether it is a DVD or via YouTube, are appropriate for their age. We are becoming increasingly aware of some of our youngest children watching horror films, which are completely inappropriate. Films are given an age rating for a specific reason, but we currently have an increasing number of children coming into school and openly describing characters and scenes from certain horror movies. Young children find it difficult to tell the difference between what is real and what is fantasy, so hearing about such things can be extremely frightening and distressing.

Please think carefully about what your child is watching and that it is age appropriate.
